Does your have a Company Security Review (CSR) in Place?



The Transportation Security Administration has implemented a voluntary CSR program to assist motor carriers in establishing sound security practices for their operations. Recently, a pilot project was conducted in Missouri with the assistance of the FMCSA, DOT, CVSA and MoDot on 2,500 motor carriers. The program was, and still is, voluntary and has been developed by the TSA to assist the transportation industry in establishing sound security programs and practices.

CSRs Serve to:

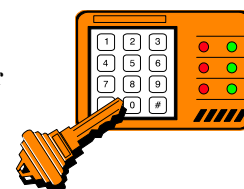
- Evaluate and collect physical and operational preparedness information and critical asset and key points-of-contact lists.
- Review emergency procedures and domain awareness training.
- Establish a baseline of security.
- Provide an opportunity to share industry best practices.

The Primary Goals of the CSR are to:

1. Validate implementation of Corporate Security Plans.
2. Gather security data for intra/intermodal comparative and trend analyses.
3. Identify, analyze, and mitigate corporate security gaps.
4. Develop security management reports generated by a robust security database.
5. Supply baseline data that can be used to develop security standards.
6. Provide domain awareness of security measures throughout the transportation sector.
7. Promote outreach to transportation stakeholders as a means to ensure ongoing communication and foster stakeholder relationships.

The Benefits of Having a CSR Conducted Include the Following:

- Provides data indicating the degree to which companies/states are implementing Corporate Security Plans.
- Expands the TSA's domain awareness of existing mitigation strategies being employed throughout the different transportation modes.
- Evaluates transportation facility/system security posture to determine how prepared they are to protect critical assets.
- Provides the necessary data to identify a current security baseline and conduct gap, comparative, and trend analyses.
- Provides the TSA the ability to develop and share best practices with stakeholders.
- Reduces your risk exposure from cargo and equipment theft, vandalism and terrorist activity by improving corporate, terminal and en-route security measures recommended by the findings of a CSR.
- Seal of approval from the TSA after completing a CSR could be used in your company's marketing and sales efforts and in reducing liability and exposure.
- Corporate Security Reviews are currently voluntary but may someday become mandatory. Why not be more secure, ahead of, and prepared for the process?
- No fines are currently being assessed. The TSA wants to help you improve your company's security awareness and the security of our nation's highway and motor carrier system.



The CSR Process

During a CSR, standardized questions are asked as part of the process for gathering information. These questions can be divided into 10 functional areas:

1. Threat Assessment
2. Vulnerability Assessment
3. Critical Infrastructure
4. Management and Oversight
5. Personnel Security
6. Training
7. Secure Areas
8. Physical Security Countermeasures
9. Cyber Security
10. Exercises
